


SPEECH/LANGUAGE PATHOLOGIST

CESA 5 Speech/Language Pathologists (SLP) work with learners in the education setting who have a variety of communication needs.



- Speech/Language Pathologists support communication needs such as:
  - Articulation
  - Fluency
  - Phonology Disorders
  - Pragmatic Language
  - Receptive and Expressive Language Disorders
  - Voice Disorders

## Disabilities

- Speech/Language Pathologists may also work with students who have complex communication needs associated with other disabilities such as:
  - o Autism
  - Brain Injuries
  - o Physical Impairments

## Service Delivery

• Several options are available for service delivery so that the student's individual needs are met. These options range from consultation and training with the student's educational team to one-to-one intervention with the student.

## Training & Support

• Speech/Language Pathologists work closely with teachers to support and enrich communication development in the classroom and can work with school districts to provide training on communication-related topics.
